2014 Legislative Advocacy Agenda Recommendations

The Public Policy Committee met February 19, 2014 and approved the following recommendations for the UWSELA 2014 Legislative Advocacy Agenda.

Mass Incarceration/Criminal Justice Reform

STUDY all legislation in its entirety and recommend what we will take position on at a later date.

Medicaid Maximization

SUPPORT quality responsible legislation to provide affordable health care coverage to as many underinsured or uninsured as possible. **SUPPORT** United Way to include a campaign to get factual information on ACA to the at risk population regarding access to health care.

Early Childhood Education - Whole Child Health - Preschool for All

SUPPORT legislation in favor of Early Childhood Education and Whole Child Health. We are advocating for increased funding for the implementation of Act 3 to ensure we provide greater access to quality programing for at risk children 0-3. UWSELA has been working with DHH to secure the funding necessary to implement a statewide 5-site pilot for the Whole Child Health Initiative.

Improving HS Graduation Rates – Career Readiness – Workforce Training and Revamping Louisiana High School Diploma OPPOSE any legislation that attempts to abolish Common Core. SUPPORT the Governor's plan for increased funding K-12 and Higher Education.

Financial Security – Eliminating Poverty

SUPPORT legislation for Pay Day Lending - capping interest rates at 36%. This legislation is being sponsored by Rep. Ted James.

Domestic Violence

SUPPORT legislation for Domestic Violence that will increase support for victims and their families. At the Public Policy Committee request and that of our DV Collaborative Partners, Rep. Helena Morena has prepared several pieces of legislation that will be pre-filed by February 28th. Sen. J.P. Morrell will also be introducing companion legislation in the Senate as well.

Other Issues

Equal Pay for Women SUPPORT legislation for equal pay for equal work.

Minimum Wage Increase

SUPPORT a state minimum wage of \$9.00.
