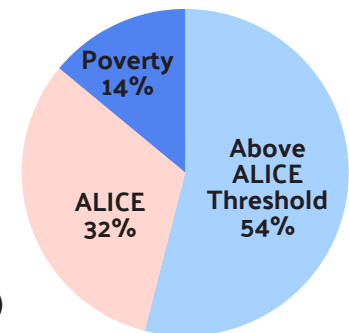

\$252,854 Granted in UWSELA programmatic funding across 43 partner agencies and 47 programs

\$194,710 Distributed by UWSELA in Emergency Food and Shelter (EFSP) grants, Phase 40

\$31,246 Provided in rent/mortgage and utility assistance to 39 families through UWSELA's Moving Families Forward program

\$188,006 Returned in savings on prescriptions through UWSELA's SingleCare partnership

\$20,000 Invested in two small business owners through our Thriving African-American Small Business Initiative

\$11,000 Supported 40 hours of consulting time for the Jefferson Ready Start Network and 44 hours for strategic planning and advocacy

Designed to keep families in their homes and their children in their school of origin to allow them to succeed I Case managers work with families for up to 18 months to create an intensive plan to help the family stabilize and thrive

IDA PROJECT

A matched-savings account program helping low-income individuals purchase long-term assets

THRIVING AFRICAN-AMERICAN SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE

A small business investment and education program aimed at closing the racial wealth gap and addressing barriers faced by small Black-owned businesses

RISE INVESTMENT PROGRAM

Designed to address the ongoing challenges experienced by ALICE households in Southeast Louisiana I The program distributes seed investment grants to participant's investment accounts and provides access to financial wellness education and other resources to help increase their investing confidence, financial wellness, and long-term wealth
